
# THANK YOU

Thank you to all the families that came to the latest family Forum in person and virtually. It was great to see families sharing ideas and giving advice to each other!

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This term in English we've been busy learning about the literacy that's around us every day.

McGuinness have started the new year learning about scientific advancements in the Victorian times through their reading of Mary Shelley's 'Frankenstein', and are currently creating their own characters to rival Frankenstein' monster! We're looking forward to sharing some of their descriptions later in the term.

Brecel are learning all about the powerful language of advertising and we're starting to practice using persuasive techniques. Families be warned- you may find yourselves being 'manipulated' by language as our students become more confident in applying these techniques! Dawson and Einstein are learning about 'The News' and are understanding that this is sometimes reported with bias or written with a specific demographic audience in mind. We're looking forward to welcoming a local journalist to class to tell us about their job and answer questions that the students have prepared. The term will finish with students writing their own news report- a selection of which we'll publish on our social media page.

We were delighted to return to school after Christmas to an excellent set of Exam results for Tesla; it was an encouraging start to the new year for our oldest students. Both Tesla and Kissin are working towards their Functional Skills Reading exams which they'll sit in the next couple of weeks and we've been delighted with the mature approach they have applied to preparing for these.

In other news, we've rolled out a 'Drop Everything and Read' programme across the whole school and Learning Families are sharing a nonfiction article or fiction extract each week with focussed discussion questions to expand students' engagement with different texts and genres. Recently we read a rather topical article about school closures due to snow and this was both timely and a great opportunity to share our opinions.

In addition, all learning families were asked for book requests, and we now have a large list of requests which have been submitted to Devon School Library Services and we'll be visiting their depot tomorrow to choose a selection to add to our Reading Room here at ACE. Weekly reading sessions are continuing for all classes so this new selection of reading material will be most welcome! 

Across our school's base and community hub, BOUNCE! currently delivers 70 sessions of psychotherapy and counselling a week. Supporting as many families.
