

Excelsior ADC has spaces for boys in its gymnastics and Parkour classes in Willand village hall on Tuesdays.



CooLTech


For Year 11, they have been completing an assignment on measuring sound waves. They all have had to take on the role of a science technology reviewer for online Tech reviews company "CoolTech". Their brief was to compare different passive speaker designs to see which works well or not, They designed and then completed the investigation and are now writing up the reports.



Speaker type b seems the most effective for low and medium frequencies but wasn't so good at high frequencies. Speaker type A was the best for high and almost matched b on medium tones. Speaker type c was by far the worse and faired even worse than nothing at all appearing to make it even quieter.

n Conclusion....

For bass tones id use speaker type B (the beaker) and for higher tones id use speaker A (the coke can one) id avoid C as it appears to make all tones quieter than even when the one is on its own.



For Year 10 they are have just finished their chemistry topic where we were using lots of "desk models" to learn how the water in our taps is made safe for us.

In Year 9 we were learning about elements, the periodic table reactions to make compounds and how to separate mixtures

We used the nice new fume cupboard to look at the reactions of the group 1 "Alkali metals" like lithium, sodium, potassium and as they fizzed, and burnt with bright coloured flames when added to water. We explored the group 7 gases like fluorine, chlorine and bromine noting how poisonous and reactive they were. Then we combined the two – watching what happens when you react the very reactive sodium metal with the evil poisonous gas chlorine...... and then get some table salt you could put on your chips












Preparation and then delivery of a powerpoint on each of the planets.


