

Student Voice

As part of the student forum, students discussed many topics within the school. In one of our latest forums the use of 5 point scales in classrooms were the topic of conversation. Students, with help from Mr Morgan, did a poll with students where they were able to vote whether they wanted 5 point scales to remain on table in classrooms or to be removed.



Although the results are in favour of removing 5-point scales from the tables, we need to be aware that it is a valuable tool that many of our students like to refer to. The following actions can be carried out:

- 1. Remove 5-point Scales from student desks
- 2. Each classroom should have a set of laminated 5-point Scales that can be placed on a desk if requested (these can be stored in a basket and available for all students)
- 3. Each Classroom should have an A3 size 5-point Scale on the wall which is clearly visible


The 5 Point Scale is used to assist students in becoming aware of their emotions, such as anger or pain, and the stage or level of the emotion. The scale can be particularly effective for students with Autism.
